With this reorganisation of these web pages not only has access to the various types of helps have been combined, but access to the requirements as written in the manual has been included.

By clicking on the [Manual](#) button from one of the class pages you will access the requirements for that component of the course.

To access these pages you will need Adobe Acrobat on your computer. You can download a free copy of this from the web site at <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat>. There is currently an icon at the bottom right of the page which reads "get Adobe reader". Click on this button and follow the prompts.

The manual as found on the General Conference Adventurer web site is over 9 Mbytes in size. On this site the South Pacific Manual has been broken into small pieces to make it easier for those with slow Internet servers.

We have also combined several sections of the manual. The printed manual is divided into six sections, one for each class, one for the Awards, and the one at the start which contains administrative matters. However, in the administration section there are goals for each track in the classes and concepts included in each component. A few pages further on are Objectives for each component. These give valuable suggestions as to why each component is included.

In the manual sections here we have followed the actual Requirement listing, with the relative goals, concepts and objectives for that requirement. Then we have followed with the sections headed Background Information and Teaching Tips. We have not included the section headed Workbook Activity as this refers to the old Activity Books and there are now far more activity pages available here.

The Evaluation section has also been omitted because we felt it was often badly worded. For example it is not part of the work for an award to receive the token. The requirement is complete whether the child receives the award token or not. It is far more important that the child grasps the values and concepts that are being taught, and learns new attitudes to life. Thus a new section headed Norm's Notes has been inserted to attempt to highlight the values to be taught etc.

At the end of each manual extract the pages in the printed manual from which the material was taken are listed for cross- reference purposes.
