How to Make Wise Choices.

Think

- What can I do?
- What are the different choices I can make?

Think again

- About each choice and what will happen if I make that choice.
- What are the consequences or results of each choice likely to be.

Decide Which choice is best

- Is it the right thing to do?
- Does it hurt or upset other people?
- Does it keep you out of trouble?

Do it

- And if it is a good choice tell yourself
"Well done, I made a good choice"

Make good choices a habit!

Five Step of Making Wise Choices.

Stop

- What is the Problem?

Think

- What do you know?
- What are the facts?

Imagine

- What might happen?

Decide

- What is the best decision for you?

Act

- Don't change you mind!
