The Second has some illustrations that could be used, or you can draw your own.

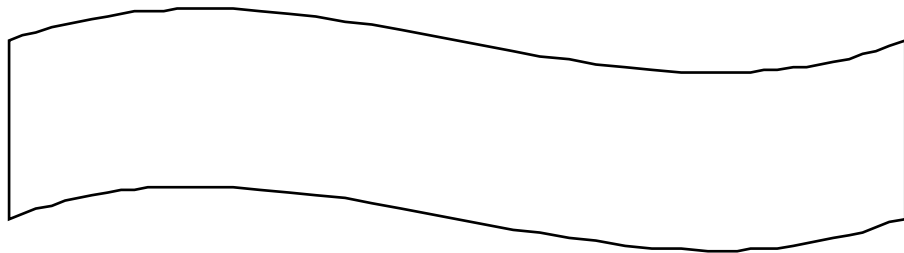
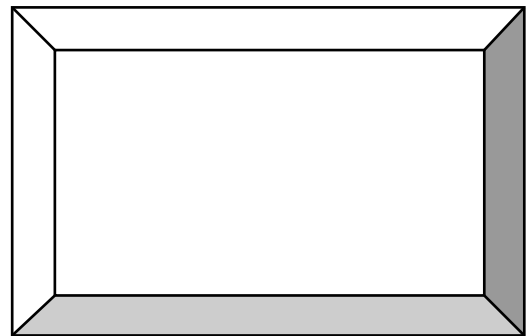
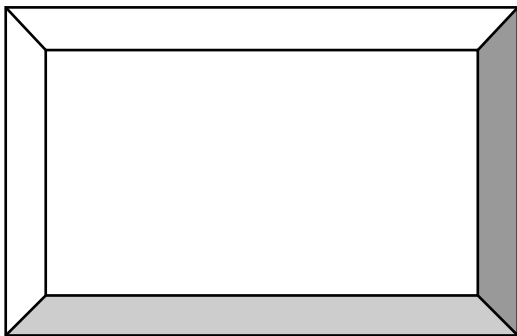
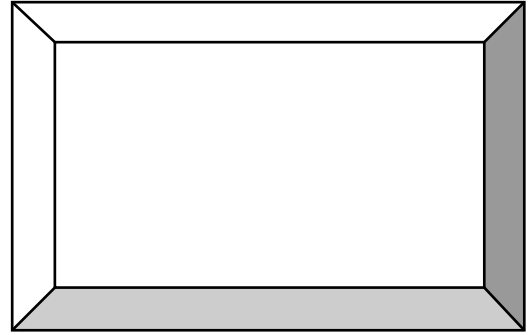
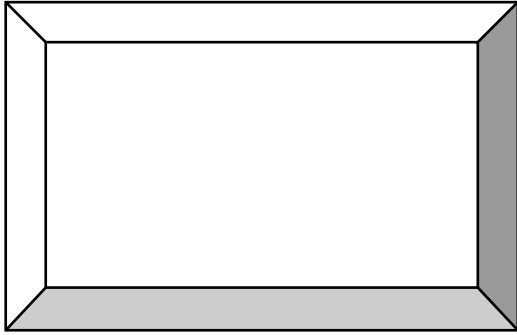
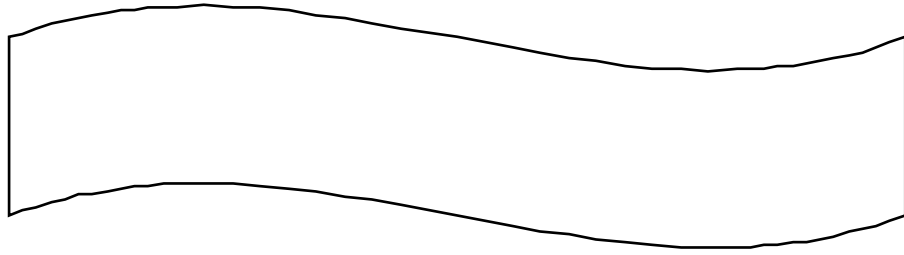
The Third page has a much freer banner outline.

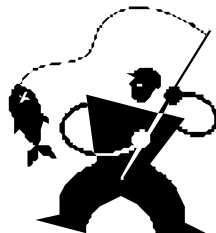
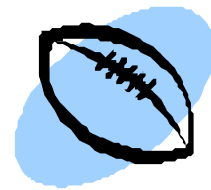
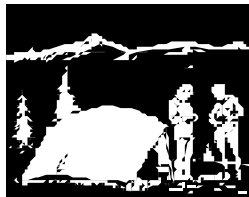
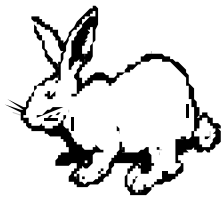
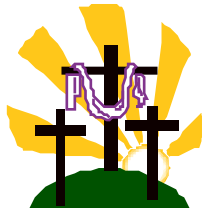
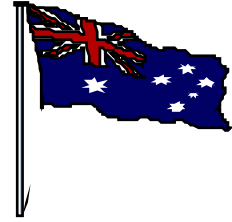
Finally there are some texts about banners in Bible times, that the teacher might like to read and discuss with the class as they work.

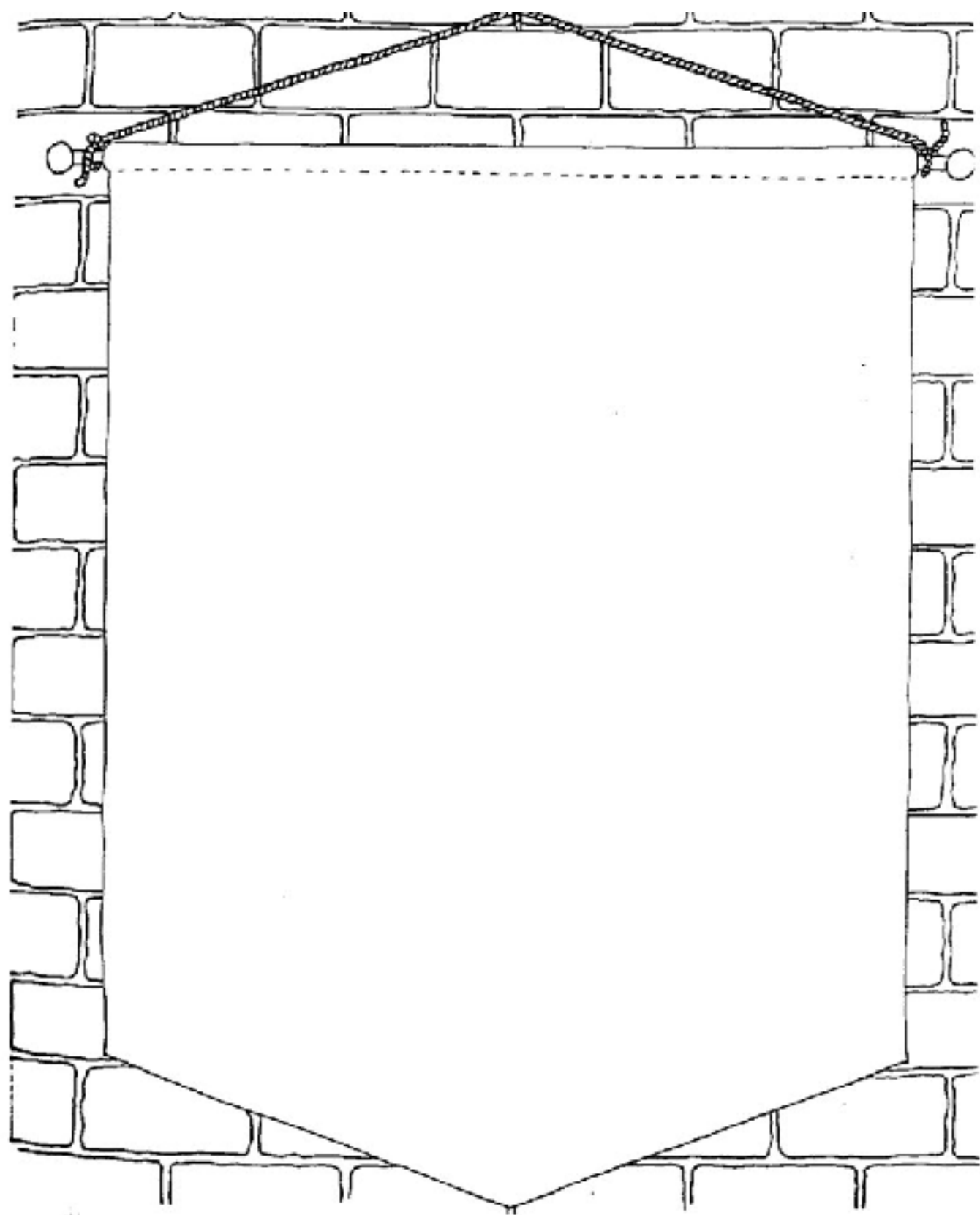


My Family Banner

Biblical References - "Banners"

Numbers 2:2-3 "Each tribe will be assigned its own area in the camp, and the various groups will camp beneath their family banners. The Tabernacle will be located at the center of these tribal compounds.

Numbers 2:3-4 'The divisions of Judah, Issachar, and Zebulun are to camp toward the sunrise on the east side of the Tabernacle, beneath their family banners. These are the names of the tribes, their leaders, and the number of their available troops:

Numbers 2:10 'The divisions of Reuben, Simeon, and Gad are to camp on the south side of the Tabernacle, beneath their family banners. These are the names of the tribes, their leaders, and the number of their available troops:

Numbers 2:18 'The divisions of Ephraim, Manasseh, and Benjamin are to camp on the west side of the Tabernacle, beneath their family banners. These are the names of the tribes, their leaders, and the number of their available troops:

Numbers 2:25 'The divisions of Dan, Asher, and Naphtali are to camp on the north side of the Tabernacle, beneath their family banners. These are the names of the tribes, their leaders, and the number of their available troops:

Numbers 2:34 So the people of Israel did everything just as the Lord had commanded Moses. Each clan and family set up camp and marched under their banners exactly as the Lord had instructed them.

Psalm 20:5 May we shout for joy when we hear of your victory, flying banners to honor our God. May the Lord answer all your prayers.

Song 6:4 Young Man: "O my beloved, you are as beautiful as the lovely town of Tirzah. Yes, as beautiful as Jerusalem! You are as majestic as an army with banners!

Exodus 17:15 Moses built an altar there and called it 'The Lord Is My Banner.'

Numbers 1:52 Each tribe of Israel will have a designated camping area with its own family banner.

Numbers 2:17 'Then the Levites will set out from the middle of the camp with the Tabernacle. All the tribes are to travel in the same order that they camp, each in position under the appropriate family banner.

Psalm 60:4 But you have raised a banner for those who honor you, a rallying point in the face of attack.

Isaiah 11:10 In that day the heir to David's throne will be a banner of salvation to all the world. The nations will rally to him, for the land where he lives will be a glorious place.
